UK Government Confirms £17.3 Million Funding Boost to ETZ Ltd

ETZ Ltd's Chief Executive, Maggie McGinlay, recently welcomed Secretary of State for Scotland, Douglas Alexander MP to the Wind Campus in the Energy Transition Zone, following a funding boost of £17.3 million.

The welcome confirmation of funding shows that collaboration will be important in driving forward an accelerated programme of activity. This activity will help the Energy Transition Zone, and region more broadly, to position itself as the most attractive location in Europe for investment in low carbon technologies.

Scotland's Largest Energy Transition Skills Hub Officially Opens

Showcasing the success of working in collaboration, Scotland's largest Energy Transition Skills Hub, boasting a state-of-the-art welding academy, advanced manufacturing zone and future technology digital training suites, officially opened in Aberdeen on the 29th September 2025 by First Minister Rt Hon John Swinney MSP.







The First Minister of Scotland stated:

"The Energy Transition Skills Hub will be transformational in building on that proud reputation [of oil and gas expertise] and positions the city and wider region as the goto location for people seeking to develop energy skills of the future".

The Energy Transition Skills Hub was founded by ETZ Ltd, Shell UK and North East Scotland College (NESCol), with support from UK Government funding and the Scottish Government's Just Transition Fund. The new facility is located within the Skills Campus of the Energy Transition Zone, on a site adjacent to NESCol's existing Aberdeen Altens Campus.

Property Uptake Continues to Scale Across the Energy Transition Zone

The Energy Transition Zone continues to develop into an exemplar all energy supply chain hub. According to global real estate consultancy Knight Frank, in 2024 the zone accounted for 35% of Aberdeen's total industrial uptake, a 45% increase compared to the area's pre zone average. This momentum carried into 2025, with the zone representing nearly one quarter of total industrial take up. Many investors cited the Energy Transition Zone and Aberdeen South Harbour as key drivers behind their decisions, reinforcing the region's growing reputation as a prime location for energy transition investment.

The region's position as a hub for low carbon investment continues to grow. Thistle Wind Partners have announced North East Scotland as the preferred location for the operations base of the £360 million Bowdun Offshore Wind Farm. North East Scotland is home to the largest cluster of energy supply chain companies in the UK, as well as world-class ports, making it ideally placed to support offshore renewables projects.





Driving Collaboration at SPE Offshore Europe 2025

This season saw the return of SPE Offshore Europe 2025 where ETZ Ltd exhibited as part of the North East Scotland Pavilion, delivered by Invest Aberdeen. Our stand offered the opportunity to engage with the team and interact with our virtual tour, discovering how ETZ Ltd is enabling strategic growth across the low carbon energy sector through infrastructure, innovation, and collaboration.

CCUS Masterclass in Review

Taking it back to a regional focus, ETZ Ltd's latest Masterclass was hosted at Score Group in Peterhead and delivered in partnership with NECCUS and the EIC (Energy Industries Council).

The event brought together the supply chain from across North East Scotland for an insightful session focused on the future of CCUS in Scotland. The first session featured a panel of industry experts which lead into an afternoon of discussion surrounding opportunities and diversification in the CCUS sector.



Connecting North East Scotland Supply Chain with Great British Energy

ETZ Ltd hosted a workshop alongside Great British Energy (GBE) designed to connect North East Scotland's supply chain with the GBE Energy Engineered in the UK programme.

The event commenced with a keynote presentation from Rob Gilbert, GBE's Director of Supply Chain, who outlined the £1 billion investment strategy designed to support clean power and industrial growth.

This led into two breakout sessions facilitated by ETZ Ltd's Isla Robb and Martin McCormack to discuss the £300 million grant funding to support the manufacturing of offshore wind components, and the remaining £700 million which will be invested across energy supply chains.



The workshop closed with a final plenary session centred around driving regional growth in the North East of Scotland and supporting the existing industrial strengths and skills base within the region.

Harbouring Opportunities at Aberdeen's Floating Offshore Wind 2025

ETZ Ltd participated in RenewableUK and Scottish Renewables Floating Offshore Wind 2025 conference, which welcomed attendees from over 30 countries. The two-day exhibition featured insightful presentations and facilitated valuable networking opportunities.

In collaboration with Invest Aberdeen, ETZ Ltd hosted a Networking Reception at the historic Aberdeen Art Gallery, which rounded up the first day of the conference with speeches and canapés. ETZ Ltd also hosted a networking breakfast at the stand allowing continued conversation with attendees and discovery of the Energy Transition Zone virtual tour.

The conference and complementary events showcased Scotland's leadership in wind energy and fostered global connections around this critical topic.

Next Step for Nature: East Tullos Burn Enhancement Approved

ETZ Ltd has received approval from Aberdeen City Council to begin works to restore and enhance East Tullos Burn and the surrounding wetlands in St Fittick's Park, as part of our commitment to deliver tangible and long-standing environmental benefits within the local community.

This includes a series of ecological and access improvements, marking the beginning of significant investment toward the regeneration and enhancement of greenspaces in Torry. The improvements will include, sediment management and better water quality, enhanced biodiversity and native habitat, improved public pathways, additional bridges and increased seating around the area.
